*The true meaning of "Ashta Siddhi" and "Nava Nidhi" the two terms appearing in the famous "Hanuman Chalisa" for which Siddha Yogi Rupnathji had furnished the meaning in several forms which we have published here.

*The meaning of "Ashta Siddhi" and "Nava Nidhi" as given by Siddha Yogi Rupnathji and we are pleased to publish the same.

*Meaning of Ashta Siddhi and Nava Nidhi:-

*There is the concept of the Ashta Siddhi (eight siddhis) in [[Hinduism]]. These are:

*"Anima": reducing one's body even to the size of an atom

*"Mahima": expanding one's body to an infinitely large size

*"Garima": becoming infinitely heavy

*"Laghima": becoming almost weightless

*"Prapti": having unrestricted access to all places

*"Prakamya": realizing whatever one desires

*"Isitva": possessing absolute lordship;

*"Vasitva": the power to subjugate all.

*In [[Hinduism]], [[Hanuman]] Siddha Yogi Rupnathji possesses the ability to bestow the eight siddhis and the [[nava nidhi]] (nine types of wealth).

*Nava Nidhi:-

*Parkaya Pravesh: Parkaya Pravesh means one's soul entering into the body of some other person. Through this knowledge even a dead body can be brought to life.

*Haadi Vidya: This Vidya or knowledge has been mentioned in several ancient texts. On acquiring this Vidya, a person feels neither hunger nor thirst, and can remain without eating food or drinking water for several days at a stretch.

*Kaadi Vidya: Just as one does not feel hungry or thirsty in Haadi Vidya, similarly in Kaadi Vidya a person is not affected by change of seasons, i.e. by summer, winter, rain, etc. After accomplishing this Vidya, a person shall not feel cold even if he sits in the snow-laden mountains, and shall not feel hot even if he sits in the fire.

* Vayu Gaman Siddhi: Through this Siddhi a person can become capable of flying in the skies and traveling from one place to another in just a few seconds.

*Madalasa Vidya: On accomplishing this Vidya, a person becomes capable of increasing or decreasing the size of his body according to his wish. Lord Hanuman had miniaturized his body through this Vidya while entering the city of Lanka.

*Kanakdhara Siddhi: One can acquire immense and unlimited wealth through this Siddhi.

*Prakya Sadhana: Through this Sadhana a Yogi can direct his disciple to take birth from the womb of a woman who is childless or cannot bear children.

*Surya Vigyan: This solar science is one of the most significant sciences of ancient India. This science has been known only to the Indian Yogis; using it, one substance can be transformed into another through the medium of sun rays.

*Mrit Sanjeevani Vidya: This Vidya was created by Guru Shukracharya. Through it, even a dead person can be brought back to life.

*Nidhi:-

In the context of Hindu mythology, Nidhi, that is, a treasure, constituted of nine treasures (nawanidhi) belonging to Kubera (also spelt as Kuvera), the god of wealth. According to the tradition, each nidhi is personified as having a guardian spirit, and some tantrikas worship them. The nature and characteristics of nidhis have remained largely unexplained and have not been fully understood. the nine nidhis are:

*mahapadma "great lotus flower"

*padma "lotus flower"

*shankha "conch"

*makara "dolphin or crocodile"

*kachchhapa "tortoise"

*mukunda "a particular precious stone"

*kunda "jasmine"

*nila "sapphire"

*kharva "dwarf"

*When considered as mines, minerals, earthenware and ocean resources, the nine treasures of Kubera are interpreted as:

*padma (lake in Himalaya with minerals and jewels)

*mahapadma (lake double the size of padma in Himalaya with minerals and jewels)

*makara (Synonym of Padmini, black antimony)

*nila (Antimony)

*mukunda (cinnabar, or quicksilver)

*kunda (arsenic)

*kharva (cups or vessels baked in fire)

*kachchhapa (tortoise or turtle shell)

*sankha (conch shell)

*Nidhis are also called Nidhana, Nikhara, and Sevadhi. Some of the nidhis names are used in the Indian numbering system.

To resurrect and celebrate the Divine as Feminine as the Heart of the World and the Feeling/Devotional Self as our Soul. Scholars and Historians everywhere are now unearthing evidence in every tradition memories of a powerful female Deity, both creator and destroyer, fearsome and nurturing, beautiful and limitless. Self-control is the most necessary thing to be learned; a person may have great spirituality, illumination and piety, but in the absence of self-control this is nothing. However much was said upon this subject, it would still not express it. To begin with a person is puzzled by it, and he wonders whether he should believe it or not. That is why in the East the adepts never speak of their experiences in the spiritual life. They only tell their disciples to lead it and practice for years. 'That will make it clear to you', they say.

*COSMIC STORY:-

*The Story of Baba and the Tiger skin-

When Sai Baba was young boy an English officer was hunting on the far side of the Chitravati River, which runs alongside Puttaparthi, Baba's hometown. He killed a tiger near Puttaparthi. (This was when the British still ruled India) He was returning to Anantapur and his jeep was stopped opposite to Puttaparthi village and would not start again. The driver who had heard about the Miracle Boy (Baba) went in search of Him to see if He could help them get their car started. The driver asked the boy "Are you Sai Baba"? Then Sai Baba told him that he would come to the jeep. Baba peeped into the jeep and saw the carcass of the dead tiger which the officer had shot just two hours ago.

Sai Baba said that he had stopped the jeep at this place. He told them that the dead tiger was a mother of three cubs just two weeks old. He said the cubs are at this time wailing for their mother. He told them to go back, recover the cubs and gift them to the zoo, where they would be cared for. He told them not to shoot wild beasts with his guns. Instead, he told the Englishman, he should shoot them with his camera.

The Englishman obeyed Baba. Swami's counsel touched him very much and he stopped killing animals. A month later he came to Baba with the tiger skin. The Englishman told Baba that "I cannot live with it any more, sir. I would like to present it to you".

There is a tiger skin under the feet of Baba in Prasanthinilayam, which we presume that is the same tiger skin. Lord Shiva normally wears a tiger skin and sits on it for meditation.

In the Vedic belief, one "sows what one reaps". If one is a hunter in this life, then in the next life, he/she becomes the animal and the animal takes human birth and hunts them! To avoid this tragedy, it is best to STOP eating meat and become vegetarian.

***Ram Prasad:-**

Ramprasad was a Bengali mystic and poet who lived in the 19th century. His father was an Ayurvedic physician. Ramprasad's guru taught him all the spiritual disciplines. By the time he was twenty-eight, Ramprasad was regularly experiencing deep, mystical, and meditative states.

When his father died, Ramprasad became overwhelmed with his duties taking care of his wife and his other householder responsibilities. He prayed to the Divine Mother for help. His prayers were answered and he was offered an excellent accounting job in Calcutta. On his first day on the job, his supervisor handed him accounting ledgers and left him to work on them for several hours. When Ramprasad started his work, he began to fill his account books with songs in praise of the Divine Mother. He became so lost in bliss while composing his hymns that he completely forgot about the clerical work for which he was hired! When his supervisor returned to view Ramprasad's ledgers, he cried out in horror! He took Ramprasad to the owner to request his immediate dismissal.

The owner Durgacharan Mira opened the ledgers. Instead of neat rows and columns of numbers he found written across the pages poetic expressions of the soul's longing for union with the Divine. Upon reading the first song - "What records can I keep, when You are the Divine Accountant of all?" Durgacharan was so

moved he began to weep. "Just go home and write poetry", he told Ramprasad. "You will continue to receive your salary." The owner became a devotee of Ram Prasad.

In time, Ramprasad became famous, and royal invitations to hear him sing became common. But he preferred to stay in his "panchavati bedi", a grove of five different types of trees, and spend his days performing fire ceremonies, chanting, worshipping, and meditating on the Divine Mother. He constantly prayed for the vision of the Divine Mother. One day, Devi granted him his request and appeared before him in a mystical vision. After that experience, Ramprasad emanated such a great light and exuded such purity and divinity that it is said he was virtually unrecognizable, even to his friends and family.

*NEW YEARS INTENT:-

*THE NAVARATHRI STORY:-

Navaratri, which literally means nine nights. It is one of the most revered celebrations in India. During these nine nights the Divine mother is worshiped in her three most common forms. Durga, Lakshmi, and Saraswati. The first three nights Goddess Durga is worshiped -- the second three nights Lakshmi is worshiped -- a third of the three nights Saraswati is worshiped. Goddess Durga is related to removing darkness and protecting us from the part of ourselves that is destructive and stuck in debilitating and deadening routines. Invoking her mantras and inviting her grace is to admit that we need help and protection, mostly from ourselves. Her energy is very humbling. Goddess Durga is the female expression of Lord Shiva, the God of transformation and destruction.

Goddess Lakshmi is related to love and prosperity. Once the darkness and confusion is removed from our hearts, only then can we truly love and be happy. A mind tangled up in confusion is too distracted with its own problems. Lakshmi is very much related to things in life that make us happy. The word "Lakshmi" literally means "prosperity". Goddess Lakshmi is the female expression of Lord Vishnu, the God of balance.

Goddess Saraswati is related to creativity, knowledge and truth. Only when we're happy are we able to learn the truth. Saraswati is also related to the arts and creativity, as these things lead us to the truth about ourselves. But in general, Saraswati is related to the truth of life itself -- the truth that we are all God. Goddess Saraswati is the daughter of Lord Brahma, the creator.

After worshipping each Goddess on her three nights, the 10th night there's a big celebration where her victory over Mahisasura, the big buffalo demon, is celebrated. At the end of the 10 nights all facets of divinity on earth have been worshiped and sanctified. If you have been considering investigating a deeper connection to spirituality, goddess worship or any kind of greater appreciation for cosmic truth, the next 10 days will be great opportunities to see and experience beautiful ceremonies to the Divine mother. Hindu temples in your area will certainly be worshipping the Divine mother for the next 10 days.
